DECREE N° 76-281 of 20-4-76

determining the conditions of entry into

Côte d'Ivoire of foreign goods of all origins and sources, as well as the conditions of export and re-export of goods to foreign countries.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC,

On the report of the Minister of Trade and the Minister of Economy and Finances;

CONSIDERING the Constitution of the Republic of Côte d'Ivoire, in particular its article 24;

- CONSIDERING the law of July 11, 1938, on the general organization of the Nation for wartime, in particular its articles 46 to 47 maintained in force by law 51.248 of March 1, 1951;
- CONSIDERING Law No. 60.273 of September 1960 regulating prices in Côte d'Ivoire and in particular its article 1, amended by Law No. 60-492 of December 21, 1964;;

CONSIDERING Law No. 63.292 of June 24, 1963, relating to the establishment of quota measures necessary for the protection of national industries;

CONSIDERING Law No. 67.285 of June 30, 1967 relating to financial relations with foreign countries;

CONSIDERING Ordinance No. 75.647 of September 30, 1975 prohibiting the establishment of second-hand clothing reconditioning factories and banning the import of all second-hand clothing items;

- CONSIDERING Decree No. 64.591 of December 16, 1968 regulating financial relations with foreign countries;
- CONSIDERING decree of 1 September 1939 regulating the import of Goods of all origins and sources and the texts which have modified and completed it;
- CONSIDERING decree of 30 November 1944, laying down the conditions for importing foreign goods into France and the French Overseas Territories, as well as the conditions for exporting and re-exporting goods from France and the French Overseas Territories to foreign countries, and the texts that have modified and completed it;
- CONSIDERING decree N° 75-432 of 12 June 1975, subjecting goods imported into Cote d'Ivoire to qualitative and quantitative inspection and price comparison;
- CONSIDERING decree N° 74-341 of 24 July 19+74, appointing members of the Government;
- CONSIDERING decree No. 74-645 of 14 November 1974, establishing the powers of the Minister of Trade;

THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS HEARD,

DECIDES

TITLE I - GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Article 1.- This decree determines the conditions of entry into Côte d'Ivoire of foreign goods of any origin and from any source, as well as the conditions of export and re-export to foreign countries.
- Article 2.- Nothing in this decree shall prevent
 - a) prohibitions or restrictions on imports or transit on grounds of public morality, public policy or public security, the protection of human, animal or plant life or health, the protection of national treasures of artistic, historic or archaeological value, or the protection of industrial or commercial property;
 - b) Measures relating to consumer protection, product packaging, customs control, control of financial relations with foreign countries.

TITLE II - PROVISIONS ON THE IMPORTATION OF FOREIGN GOODS

- <u>Article 3.-</u> The entry into Côte d'Ivoire, under any customs regime, of foreign goods of any origin and from any source, is free.
- Article 4.- By way of derogation from Article 3 above, the goods listed in Annex A to this Decree are subject to the import license formality

TITLE III - PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE EXPORT OF GOODS TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES

- <u>Article 5.</u> The export and re-export from Côte d'Ivoire under any customs regime of any goods destined for foreign countries is free.
- <u>Article 6.</u> By way of derogation from Article 5 above, the goods listed in Annex B to this decree are subject to the export license formality.

TITLE IV - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 1: "returns" regime

- Article 7. Goods originating in the Ivorian customs territory; or nationalized by the payment of duties, returning from abroad, may be admitted without an import license formality, when the conditions provided for by the customs regulations on the "returns" regime are met.
 - **S**ection 2: privileged regimes, special immunities, non-commercial shipments.
- <u>Article 8</u>. 1 The formalities of an import or export license do not apply to consignments which benefit from privileged customs procedures, special immunities and, more generally, consignments which are not of a commercial nature

2 - Orders of the Minister of Trade shall determine the operations that may benefit from the provisions of paragraph 1 above.

Section 3: Customs union - free trade zone

- Article 9.- Under the conditions that he determines, the Minister of Trade may dispose of the formalities provided for in Articles 4 and 6 of this decree, the goods:
- a) originating in or coming from countries with which Côte d'Ivoire has concluded a customs union treaty or a free trade agreement;
 - b) exported to the countries defined in paragraph a) above.

TITRE V - FINAL PROVISIONS

- Article 10.- All regulatory measures taken in application of article 46 of the law of 11 July 1938 on the general organization of the Nation for wartime are repealed, in particular:
- **the decree of** 1 September 1939 regulating the import of goods of all origins and sources, and the texts that have modified and completed it.;
- the decree of 30 November 1944 laying down the conditions for importing foreign goods into France and the French overseas territories, as well as the conditions for exporting and re-exporting goods from France and the French overseas territories to other countries, and the texts that have amended and completed it.
 - Article 11.- The Ministers of Trade and of Economy and Finance are responsible, each in his or her own area of responsibility, for the application of this decree, which will be published in the Official Gazette of the Republic of Côte d'Ivoire and will take effect from 1 May 1976.
